

TRIBUNAL BOOK OF AUTHORITIES

A party should provide a book of authorities containing copies of decisions referred to in legal argument to the hearing panel or review board.

To assist parties and reduce costs, the LSBC Tribunal has developed a Tribunal Book of Authorities containing frequently cited cases. A party relying on any case included in the Tribunal Book of Authorities need not reproduce that case in its book of authorities. In written and oral argument, parties should refer to the citation and tab number of the case in the Tribunal Book of Authorities, and the paragraph number(s) relied upon.

The Tribunal Book of Authorities is posted on the LSBC Tribunal website at www.LSBCTribunal.ca. It is available to all adjudicators and a hard copy is available in each hearing room.

The Tribunal Book of Authorities is meant to facilitate the hearing process by relieving parties of the need to copy or file frequently cited cases. It is not a complete list of relevant cases or a statement of law. LSBC Tribunal decisions are reported on the CanLII website at http://www.canlii.org/en/. They can also be found in the Law Society's Regulatory Database at www.lawsociety.bc.ca/lsbc/apps/hearings/search.cfm

Cases are added to and deleted from the Tribunal Book of Authorities from time to time. Any questions or comments concerning the Tribunal Book of Authorities, including recommendations for additions to or deletions from the list, should be directed in writing to the Tribunal Office. The parties remain responsible for making copies of all other authorities to which they wish to refer. Parties are asked to make all books of authorities double sided.

For virtual hearings (Zoom hearings), the parties may upload an index of authorities. Cases listed in the index should be hyperlinked to the corresponding decision on the CanLII website. A PDF copy of any authority or secondary material not available on CanLII must be uploaded to the sync hearing folder.
